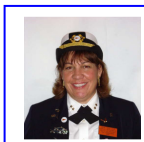

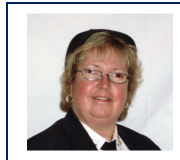
FROM THE JUNIOR PAST COMMODORE

Shipboard Galley

Hornet's Nest Cake

- 1 small box vanilla pudding mix (regular, not instant)
- 2 cups milk
- 1 box yellow cake mix
- 6 ounces butterscotch chips
- 1 cup nuts, chopped

Cook pudding as directed on package and let cool. Mix pudding and dry cake mix well. (You can beat for 2 minutes for a lighter cake, but it is not necessary. The cake comes out moist, dense, and very good this way). Spread batter in a greased 9x13x2-inch pan. Sprinkle with butterscotch morsels and nuts. Bake for 25 minutes in a preheated 350 oven.

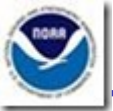

NOAA – OTEC website launched



The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) issued a [news release](#) stating that it has launched a [website](#) containing information for industries interested in developing Ocean Thermal Energy Conversion (OTEC) capability in the United States. OTEC produces renewable energy by using temperature differences between deep cold water and warm surface water to power a turbine to generate electricity. (2/10/11).

House – bill introduced to prohibit drilling off West Coast



Representative Garamendi (D-CA) introduced a bill (H.R. 612) to amend the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act to permanently prohibit the conduct of offshore drilling on the outer Continental Shelf off the coast of California, Oregon, and Washington. Official text of the bill has not yet been posted. (2/10/11).

North Atlantic – EPIRB and AMVER combine to rescue sailor



The US Coast Guard issued a [multimedia release](#) stating that a French sailor whose sailboat was disabled by heavy weather in the North Atlantic 1,400 miles east of San Juan was rescued through the coordination of Emergency Position-Indicating Radio Beacon (EPIRB) technology and the Automated Mutual-assistance Vessel Rescue (AMVER) program. As the sailboat began to sink, the French national entered his liferaft and activated his EPIRB. Because the EPIRB had been properly registered, the US Coast Guard, when it received the signal, knew exactly who was in distress and where to look. Checking its AMVER database, it identified a merchant vessel in the immediate area. The vessel was contacted, diverted to the scene, and quickly rescued the sailor. (2/4/11).

DHS OIG – review of USCG polar icebreaking program



The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Office of Inspector General (OIG) issued the report of its examination of the US Coast Guard polar icebreaker maintenance, upgrade, and acquisition program. The report concludes that the Coast Guard does not have the necessary budgetary control over its icebreakers, nor does it have a sufficient number of icebreakers to accomplish its missions in the Polar Regions. Unless changes are made, the Coast Guard will not have the capability to perform its polar missions, will lose critical icebreaking expertise, and may be beholden to foreign nations to perform its statutory missions. [OIG-11-31](#) (2/8/11). *Note: Congress is primarily to blame for this state of affairs. It transferred funding control over icebreakers from the Coast Guard to the National Science Foundation.*

USCG – State of the Coast Guard and Commandant's Direction



The US Coast Guard issued a [news release](#) reporting that Admiral Bob Papp delivered the annual [State of the Coast Guard Address](#). He noted that, while the service is ready to meet its mission demands, it faces real challenges, particularly with regard to the budget. Admiral Papp almost released the [Commandant's Direction](#), containing four priorities: (1) Sustaining Mission Excellence; (2) Recapitalizing and Building Capacity; (3) Enhancing Crisis Response and Management; and (4) Preparing for the Future. (2/10/11).

USCG – hull identification numbers for recreational vessels



The US Coast Guard issued a notice stating that it has decided to not initiate a rulemaking addressing an expanded hull identification number (HIN) for recreational vessels. In making this decision, the Coast Guard considered comments submitted on the costs and benefits of expanding the existing 12-character HIN in order to provide additional information identifying vessels. [76 Fed. Reg. 7757](#) (February 11, 2011).

CRS – shutdown of the federal government



The Congressional Research Service (CRS) issued a report entitled “Shutdown of the Federal Government: Causes, Processes, and Effects”. The report was prepared in the event that Congress is unable (or unwilling) to come to an agreement on the continued funding of the federal government. The current funding legislation (a continuing resolution) is due to expire on March 4. The report points out those certain federal officials (including Members of Congress, the President, and Presidential appointees) are exempt. Certain other federal employees are considered essential and will continue doing whatever they are doing. The remainder may have to cease work, at least temporarily. Various federal activities are excepted from any shutdown. Excepted activities include, but are not limited to, national security, foreign relations, public health and safety, transportation safety and protection of transport property, border and coastal protection and surveillance, protection of federal property, waterways, and equipment, law enforcement, and emergency assistance. [RL34680](#) (2/18/11). *Note: From the maritime perspective, it appears that most Coast Guard and Customs activities are excepted from the shutdown, if one is to occur. The Maritime Administration and the Federal Maritime Commission may not benefit from this exception, though.*

Subject: Trip Report – 2011 USPS ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

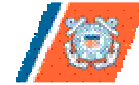
During the period 3 – 5 February 2011, I attended and represented NBF at the 2011 USPS AGM at Disneyland – Orlando, FL.

USCG – FY 2012 budget



Admiral Bob Papp, Commandant, US Coast Guard, issued a message outlining the President’s budget for the Coast Guard for fiscal year 2012. The budget provides for delivery of the *CGC Stratton*, the third National Security Cutter (NSC), as well as further work on the planned fourth and fifth NSCs. Three of the older cutters are to be decommissioned, as well as the icebreaker *Polar Sea* and MSST Anchorage. Monies are requested for acquisition of six fast response cutters and various replacement aircraft. [ALCOAST 059/11](#) (2/15/11).

Citations for Boating under the Influence and EPIRB carriage proposal

At the recent meeting of the Recreational Boating Association of Washington, we addressed these two issues - Citations for Boating tied to Drivers License, and the mandatory EPIRB carriage proposal.

Here is the RBAW position:

RBAW does not feel the epirb or dsc was a big issue for us since the vast majority of our members don't go 3 miles off shore. We were concerned about further regulations and the costs associated with having to buy required equipment. That being said, perhaps the regulation might distinguish between what's required in inland waters and what's required when going offshore more than three miles. We might support carriage over 3 miles out since our North Pacific waters can be very dangerous when out in the open ocean, but as said, most of our 260,000 registered boaters stay on the inside passages.

RBAW would not support BUI being tied to your driver's license--it's apples and oranges and where does it stop? This may be nearer and dearer to us in Washington as there are rumors from Olympia that our state will have it's own proposed legislation for this in the works and RBAW will oppose it. I will keep you posted on that.

Notice to Mariners for Sailing Vessels and Yachts in High Risk Waters WARNING TO: U.S. Registered Yachts and Sailing Vessels

The U.S. Coast Guard strongly advises against all operation of and travel by U.S. yachts and sailing craft, or by U.S. citizens on foreign registered yachts and sailing craft, on the Gulf of Aden, Arabian Sea, Somali Basin and the western parts of the Indian Ocean. A U.S. registered sailing vessel was hijacked by pirates in February 2011 off the southern coast of Oman in the northern Arabian Sea and all of its crew were tragically killed. This case is a stark reminder of the grave dangers of operating in these high risk waters, especially by recreational vessels.

All mariners already in these waters are urged to register with the Maritime Security Centre (Horn of Africa) <<http://www.mschoa.org>> for up to date advice and guidance on passage round the Horn of Africa. They should also report regularly to the UKMTO (email: ukmto@eim.ae; Tel: +971 50 552 3215), giving location, course and speed, and plan their routing carefully to reduce the risk of an attack.

Piracy is a significant threat in the Gulf of Aden and the northwest Indian Ocean and has occurred in excess of 1000 nautical miles from the coast of Somalia. Up-to-date information about attacks and pirated vessels can be referenced from the EU Naval Force Somalia web site at <<http://www.eunavfor.eu>>. Sailing vessels are particularly vulnerable to attack due to their low speed and low freeboard. All mariners intending to sail through high risk areas should reconsider the necessity of their travel and alternatives, such as transporting the vessel by yacht carrier.

Participants in yacht races and rallies in these high risk areas are at great risk of attack. These events are often publicized and could draw attention from pirates, despite the security and safety measures that might be put in place. The U.S. Coast Guard strongly advises mariners not to participate in events that will require transit through high risk waters.

Requirements and amplifying guidance promulgated by the U.S. Coast Guard for commercial vessels intending to transit high risk waters are unaffected by this advisory.
